and slaves, passed at December session 1831 chapter 323, was taken up for consideration. After some debate

On motion of Mr. Mayer the bill was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Morris, the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio rail road company

Was read the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message.

By the House of Delegates, March 19, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

The bill to divide Baltimore and Frederick counties, and to create a new one by the consent of a majority of the voters of each of those parts designated, has been received from your body with amendments. We have adopted some of them and rejected that which requires the voters of both Baltimore and Frederick counties to express a sentiment on the adoption or rejection of the bill. Believing that the people within the limits of the new county are alone immediately interested in said division, for they alone know how to estimate justly the inconveniences which they have to suffer from their distance from the seat of justice, and they alone will have to incur the expenses incident to the establishing of a new county; and therefore respectfully desire that your honorable body will recede from said amendment.
