Mr. Dennis from the committee to which was referred the resolution in favor of Samuel G. Osborn, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution relative to a state bank, reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to be assented to.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, dissented from and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Devnis from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of the adjutant general, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee on finance to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the payment of the journal of accounts reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On m ton of Mr. Sappington the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves passed at December session 1831, chapter 328 was reconsidered.

The bill was progressing in the third reading, when

On the further motion of Mr. Sappington the following amendment was read and assented to:

Strike out the 2nd section.

The bill was then read through and passed.

On motion of Mr. Sappington the following message was read and adopted, and with the bill to which it reters sent to the house of delegates.

By the Senate, March 23, 1833.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have in consequence of your last message reconsidered and passed with the additional amendment suggested by
