

Mr. Claude and Mr. Emory who were appointed to wait on his Excellency Governor Thomas and request his attendance in the senate chamber to sign and seal the engrossed bills, appeared in the senate chamber and informed the senate that they had performed the duty assigned them and had received for answer that the governor would attend at 2 o'clock, P. M.

His Excellency appeared in the senate chamber.

The engrossed bills from No. 197 to No. 209, inclusive, and from No. 295 to No. 308 inclusive, were read assented to, sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates returned the said bills endorsed, "read and assented to."

And delivered the engrossed bills of the house of delegates, from No. 210 to No. 294 inclusive, and from No. 309 to No. 318 inclusive,

Which were read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Claude it was ordered that Messrs Claude and Emory inform the house of delegates that the Governor is in readiness to sign and seal the engrossed bills and request their attendance to witness the ceremony.

Accordingly the speaker attended by the members of the house of delegates appeared in the senate chamber,

When his Excellency Governor Thomas signed and sealed the following engrossed bills, from 197 to 318 inclusive, in the presence of both branches of the general assembly, in conformity with the provisions of the constitution and form of government.

197. An act granting appeals from the court of chancery, and from the several county courts as courts of city.
