The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

THURSDAY, Jan. 2d. 1834.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The message adopted by the Senate on Tuesday, in answer to the message from the House of Delegates, proposing the appointment of a joint committee, to wait on the Governor, was sent to the Hoese of Delegates.

Mr. Chapman and Mr. Groome, from the joint committee, appointed to wait on the Governor, appeared in the Senate chamber, and stated that the committee had performed the duty assigned them, and had been requested by His Excellency, to say, he would communicate a message this day, at 12 o'clock.

Henry C. P. Wilson, a senator elect for the Eastern Shore, to supply the vacancy occasioned by the election of Littleton P. Dennis, Esqr. to the Congress of the United States, appeared in the Senate chamber, qualified by taking the several oaths prescribed by the Constitution and form of Government, and took his seat.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions.

A resolution in tavor of George G. Brewer.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Finance.

A resolution, authorising the sale of the wheels and fragments of a cannon.
