The Honorable Speaker and Members of the House of Delegates then attended in the Senate Chamber, when the Honorable James Thomas, qualified by taking the several oaths required by the Constitution and form of Government.

The Honorable Speaker and Members of the House of Delegates, having retired,

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

THURSDAY, January 9th, 1834.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The message adopted by the senate on yesterday in answer to the message from the House of Delegates, proposing that a joint letter be written to each member elect of the council informing him of his election; and requesting his attendance at the seat of government, was sent to the House of Delegates.

The President laid before the Senate a communication from Thomas Culbreth, Esq. clerk of the Council, relative to the disbursements and expenditures of the Executive during the tiscal year, made in compliance with a resolution of December session, 1830.

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

Mr. Groome from the committee, to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to alter and
