FRIDAY, January 10th, 1834.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Chapman from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the resolution granting indulgence to Isaac G. Magruder, collector of Prince Georges county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to restrain the owners of vessels from navigating the same under the sole command of negroes,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Wilson, Emory and Chapman.
