

SATURDAY, January 11th, 1834.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution authorising the Armorer to deliver certain arms to Captain Alexander Cheves,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on the Militia.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Montgomery county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Pigman and Montgomery.

A bill entitled, an act to amend an act passed at December session, 1832,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Wilson, Hughlett and Page.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Carroll Beneficial Society of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Hughlett.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise Samuel Phillips to bring into this state from the District of Columbia, certain slaves therein mentioned.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wootton, Claude and Osborn.

Mr. Sappington from the committee on the Militia, to which was referred the resolution authorising the Armorer to deliver to Captain Alexander Cheves, certain arms, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, and assented to.

The senate adjourned until Monday Morning, 10 o'clock.
