

MONDAY, January 13th, 1834.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Emory. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The resolution authorising the Armorer to deliver to Captain Alexander Cheves, certain arms, assented to by the Senate on Saturday, was returned to the House of Delegates.

The President laid before the Senate a memorial from sundry citizens of this state relative to the establishment of a State Bank,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates

January 11, 1834.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose with your concurrence the appointment of a joint committee of the two houses upon so much of the Governor's message as relates to the controversy between this state, and the Commonwealth of Virginia, in regard to the Southern and Western boundaries of this state, and that they report to the two Houses respectively, the course they deem most expedient for the state to pursue.

We have appointed on the part of this house, Messrs. Skistone, Franklin Smith, Jones, of Somerset, Knight, and Palmer, to join such gentlemen as shall be named by your Honorable body.
