

TUESDAY, January 14th, 1834.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Page and Mr. Groome. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The President laid before the senate a letter from George C. Washington, Esquire, a member elect of the Council, communicating his acceptance of that appointment.

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to authorise George W. Cummins and Jacob Raymond, administrators of John Cummins (deceased) of the state of Delaware, to remove into the said state a negro woman, named Rachel, and to sell the same in the said state, in which said negro woman, the said John Cummins, possessed an unexpired term.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Sappington and Wilson.

A bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to authorise the levy courts of Baltimore and Harford counties, to build a bridge over the Little Gunpowder Falls, at Lee's Mill, on the road leading from Baltimore to Bell Air.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Morris and Pigman.

A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act, entitled, an act passed at December session, 1831, chapter 244.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Osborn, Chapman and Montgomery.

A bill entitled, an act for the reassessment and revalu-
