Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Sappington and Chapman.

Mr. Montgomery, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy courts of Baltimore and Harford counties, to build a bridge over the Little Falls of Gunpowder, on the road leading from Baltimore to Bell Air, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time and passed.

Mr. Pigman submitted the following message:

January 14, 1834.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,
