

On motion of Mr. Morris, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to Parkin street, in the City of Baltimore, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Morris, was read the third time by special order passed and sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Pigman, the committee on Invalid Deeds and Defective Proceedings, was enlarged and made to consist of Messrs. Morris, Mayer, Chapman, Page, Wilson, Groome and Hughlett.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills, to wit:

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Insolvency.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of William Saultbury, of Caroline county.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the Coloured Population.

A bill entitled, an act relating to the surveyor of Queen Ann's county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Emory, Sappington and Groome.

A bill entitled a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the purchase of the office papers, formerly belonging to the surveyors office of Montgomery county, passed at December session 1829, chapter 126.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wootton, Pigman and Hughlett.

And returned the following bills which originated in the senate, severally endorsed "will pass."
