Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on the Library.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act to incorporate the Mechanics Saving Fund Society of Baltimore.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Morris, Sappington and Osborn.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Savings Institute.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Morris, Emory and Hughlett.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Lyceum; endorsed "will pass, with the proposed amendment."

Which amendment was read and adopted.

And was as follows.

At the end of the bill add the following additional sections:

Section 9. *And be it enacted*, That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to confer any banking privileges on the corporation herein incorporated.

Sec 10. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall continue and be in force until the year eighteen hundred and forty-five, and until the end of the next general assembly, which shall happen thereafter.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the resolutions relative to a riot in Washington county, reported favorably thereon.

They were read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the House of Delegates.
