

A bill entitled, an act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Washington county, into several election districts, and for other purposes, passed at December session, 1832, chapter 92,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Sappington and Wilson.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Edward W. Lyden, (deceased) former collector of taxes for Caroline county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Hughlett, Emory and Pigman.

And returned the resolution, which originated in the Senate, relative to the riot among the laborers on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, endorsed, "assented to."

Leave was granted to Messrs. Emory, Pigman and Morris, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act to change and alter the name of Marion Hollyday, of Washington county, to that of Nancy Ringgold Hollyday.
