

THURSDAY, January 30th, 1834.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Montgomery appeared in the Senate Chamber and resumed his seat.

The President laid before the senate a letter from Thomas W. Veazy, esquire, a member elect of the council, communicating his acceptance of that appointment.

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

Mr. Morris presented the memorial of John S. Donnell, and others, representing that their application to the corporate authorities, relative to Lombard street, has been ineffectual and praying the passage of a law to open and extend the same to Pratt street.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Wilson and Sappington.

On motion of Mr. Wootton,

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Port Deposit Rail Road Company.

Was read the third time, by special order, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a petition from sundry citizens of Washington county, relative to the jurisdiction of justices of the peace.

Which was read and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to authorize the commissioners of Anne Arundel county, to levy a sum of money sufficient to erect a bridge at the cove in said county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Claude, Chapman and Groome.
