

cause under this law, and according to the justice, and right of the matter, and the said justice of the peace, at the request of either party, shall postpone the trial, not exceeding fourteen days, and if the warrant shall be returned."

"In the 11th line of the same section, after the word "same," insert, "and shall order a copy of said warrants to be set up by the constable at the most public place, near the residence of the said justice of the peace, and it shall be the duty of the constable to set up the copy of the said warrant as directed by said justice of the peace."

The bill was then read through and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act to provide for the inspection of plaster of paris in the city of Baltimore, passed at December session, 1832, chapter 202.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Wilson from the committee on colored population, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise George W. Cummins, and Jacob Raymond, administrators of John Cummins, (deceased) of the State of Delaware, to remove into the said state a negro woman, named Rachel, and to sell the same in said state, in which said negro woman, the said John Cummins possessed an unexpired term, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments,

Which were read.

In the 10th line of the 1st section, after the word "Delaware" strike out the words "and to sell and dispose of their interest in said negro woman, in the said State of Delaware."
