

lect and employ, two additional counsel to assist the Attorney General, one of whom shall be requested to collect and prepare the evidence written or oral, to illustrate and establish the claims and pretensions of this state in regard to our southern and western boundaries.

*Resolved,* That all adversary proceedings on the part of this state, against the state of Virginia, shall cease at any time before suit brought or final judgment, when that state shall accept the overtures of Maryland, made by her resolutions at December session 1831.

*Resolved,* That the governor of this state be authorized and requested to transmit to the governor of Virginia, a copy of the foregoing report and resolutions as soon as practicable.
