granted, reported a bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act to incorporate the Neptune Insurance Company.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the petition of Albertina Anna Neilson, reported a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of Albertina Anna Neilson of the city of Ealtimore.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the location and establishment of Falls Avenue in Baltimore.

Was read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Chapman from the committee on Finance to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to provide for building a bridge over Yohogany River in Allegany county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second time.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates, February 5th, 1834.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message, and the report and memorial of the President and Visitors of the Maryland Hospital, and concur in the suggestion of your houorable body; we therefore propose that a joint committee of the two houses be appointed to inspect the condition of the institution, and ascertain its wants with a view to such enactments as may be necessary to its increased usefulness. We have appointed Messrs. Blakistone, Nichols and Wharton, to act in conjunction with such gentlemen as shall be named by your honorable body.
