Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill entitled, An act for the repaving of streets, lanes and alleys in the city of Baltimore.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Morris and Groome.

A bill entitled, An act to divorce Mary Anne Ball of Allegany county, from her husband Jacob Ball.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Divorces.

A billentitled, an act to establish the Richmand Market.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer, and Montgomery.

A bill entitled, An act to divorce Francis I. Sicard of the city of Baltimore from her husband Jean A. Sicard.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Divorces.

And returned the bill which originated in the senate entitled, a supplement to the act passed at December session 1831, chapter 86, entitled, an act to authorise the making a general alphabetical index of the land records of Baltimore county, from the year 1799 inclusive, and to keep up such index henceforth.

Endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to change the name of Elk Ridge Landing to that of Ashton, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time and the question put,

"Shall the bill pass?"

And it was determined in the negative.
