We return to you the bill entitled, “an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to promote internal improvement by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore to Washington city;” and respectfully ask your re-consideration of the same, that some provisions may be made that the stock to be subscribed by the state shall not be disposed of at less than its par value.

On motion of Mr. Morris,

The senate then resumed the consideration of the said bill.

The question was put,

“Shall the bill pass?”

And it was determined in the affirmative.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
