

The question was then put,

“Shall the bill pass?”

And it was determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Claude from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled an act to incorporate the Patapsco Bank of Maryland, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments,

Which were read and assented to:

1st. In the 3d line of the 1st section, strike out the word “to.”

2d. In the same line of the same section, after the word “at” insert the words “the village of.”

3d. In the 3d and 4th lines, same section, strike out the words “in Anne Arundel county.”

4th. In the 13th section and 9th line of the 1st fundamental article, strike out the word “other.”

5th. In the same section, 5th article, and 3th line, strike out the word “and” and insert the word “or.”

6th. In the same section, 17th article, and 9th line, strike out the word “which.”

7th. In the same section, 18th article, and 6th line, strike out the word “right” and insert the word “like.”

8th. Add at the end of the 2nd section:

“And provided that one sixth of the capital stock shall be reserved for the use and benefit of the State of Maryland, to be disposed of as may hereafter be directed by the legislature thereof.”

9th. In the 14th section, 3d line, strike out the words “and by.”

10th. In the 15th section, 6th line, strike out the word “country” and insert the word “free.”
