

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Washington Beneficial Society of Hagerstown, passed yesterday by the senate with an amendment, was returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett,

The bill entitled, an act relating to the records of conveyances in the several counties of this state,

Was read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Wilson,

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the finishing of Washington Academy in Somerset county, and for other purposes, passed at November session 1802, chapter 87, was taken up for consideration,

And the question put,

“Shall the bill pass?”

It was determined in the affirmative;

And the bill returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Morris from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment.

Which was read and assented to.

Strike out all after the word “provided” in the 8th line, and insert in lieu the words,

“That in all other respects the said deeds or instruments of writing have been executed, acknowledged and recorded in conformity with the laws relating to the subject at that time in force in this state.”
