The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Emory appeared in the senate chamber, and resumed his seat.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to sheriffs and for other purposes, passed by the senate on Saturday, and

The message adopted by the senate on Saturday, together with

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act to provide for the public instruction of youth, in primary schools throughout the state, were sent, and

The bill entitled, an act to confirm the proceedings of certain commissioners in Somerset county, and

The bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers, severally passed by the senate on Saturday with certain amendments, were returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Wilson,

The bill entitled, an act to authorise George W. Cummins and Jacob Raymond, administrators of John Cummins (deceased,) of the state of Delaware, to remove into the said state a negro woman named Rachel, and to sell the same in said state, in which said negro woman, the said John Cummins, possessed an unexpired term and the amendments heretofore proposed to said bill, were taken up for consideration.

The said amendments were read and assented to.
