

A resolution in favor of Mary Coe,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of John H. Milburn, administrator of Stephen Milburn, former collector of St. Mary's county.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Chapman, Page and Emory.

A bill entitled, a supplement to the act passed at December session, 1831, chapter 61, entitled, an act to provide for the payment of jurors in Baltimore county, without the limits of the city, and for the payment of the judges of the orphans' court of Baltimore county.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

Mr. Morris presented the memorial of William and Thomas Adair and others, praying the law may be so modified, that all passengers arriving in *one* ship may be included in *one* bond instead of a bond for each passenger as is now required.

Which was read and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

The bill entitled an act to incorporate the Patapsco Bank of Maryland.

Was read the third time as proposed to be amended and passed.
