The consideration of the said bill was postponed until to-morrow.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Mayer, Morris and Wilson, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to the city of Baltimore, passed at December session 1817.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of the land therein mentioned, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendments:

Which were read and assented to:

After the word "deed" in the 6th line, strike out the words "when signed, sealed and acknowledged," after the word provided in the 8th line strike out the words "the same be recorded in Baltimore county court within the time prescribed for the recording of other deeds" and insert in lieu thereof the words, "the said Philip Rhoades shall signify his assent to the said transfer by becoming a party to the said deed, and provided that the said deed be duly executed and acknowledged, and recorded among the land records of Baltimore county, in the manner and within the time prescribed by the existing laws of this state."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed.
