

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act for the relief of Edward W. Belt, former collector of Prince Georges county, passed at December session, 1832, chapter 153,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wootton, Wilson and Osborn.

A bill entitled, a supplement to the act to provide for the public instruction of youth, in primary schools throughout this state, passed at December session 1825, chapter 164, as far as the same relates to Kent county.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs<sup>5</sup> Osborn, Hughlett and Emory.

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act to provide for electing the levy court of Queen Anne's county, by the people.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Emory, Wootton and Pigman.

A bill entitled, an act to regulate the law terms of Prince George's county court.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

And returned the bill which originated in the house of delegates and passed the senate with sundry amendments, entitled, an act to incorporate the Patapsco Bank of Maryland, endorsed "amendments of the senate assented to with the proposed amendment."

Which amendment was read and adopted, and was as follows:

Strike out in the 14th amendment the words "governor and council" and insert the words "joint ballot of both branches of the legislature."

The bill was then sent to the house of delegates.
