On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Mr. Pigman was added to the committee on the library for the purpose of making the examination indicated in the aforegoing message.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, a supplement to the act to establish a bank in the District of Columbia.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wootton, Chapman and Wilson.

Mr. Chapman from the committee on Finance to which was referred the resolution in favor of Benjamin L. Gantt, for the use of Mrs. Elizabeth Scott, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committeee on judicial proceedings to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act relating to mortgages.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which the petition on the subject was referred, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for opening and increasing the width of German Lane in the city of Baltimore, passed at December session 1831, chapter 303.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the education of the indigent deaf and dumb of the state, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special, order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise Samuel Phillips to bring into this state from the District of Columbia, certain slaves therein named reported favorably thereon.
