the Parmers Bank of Maryland. Thomas Hayward had 61 votes, William Hughlett had 61 votes, and James Price had 63 votes for the Branch of the Farmers Bank of Maryland at Easton. Adam Whann had 63 votes for the Elkton Bank. Michael Swingly had 62 votes and Alexander Neill had 91 votes for the Hagers-Town Bank.

Whereupon it was declared that for the Mechanicks Bank of Baltimore E. L. Finley and John W. Smith of Sam'l. For the Farmers Bank of Maryland, Nicholas Brewer, Jr. George Wells and Samuel Sprigg. For the Branch of the Farmers Bank of Maryland at Easton, Thomas Hayward, William Hughlett and James Price. For the Elkton Bank, Edward Whann. For the Hagers-Town Bank, Michael Swingly [and Alexander Neill are duly elected Directors on the part of the state, for and during the present session.

Mr. Hughlett and Mr. Claude, who were appointed to wait on His Excellency Governor Thomas, and request his attendance in the Senate Chamber to sign and seal the engrossed bills, appeared in the Senate Chamber and informed the Senate that they had performed the duty assingned them, and had received for answer that the Governor would attend at 6 o'clock, P. M. for that purpose.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio rail road Company, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second time.
