It was read the second and by special order the third time rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to regulate the law terms of Prince Georges county court, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was reterred the bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session 1831, chapter 61, entitled, an act to provide for the payment of jurors in Baltimore county without the limits of the city, and for the payment of the judges of the orphans' court of Baltimore county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The President laid before the senate a communication from the treasurer of the Western Shore, made in obs-dience to resolution No. 77, of 1827.

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a memorial of sundry inhabitants of the first election district of Baltimore county, relative to the free schools in said district.

Which was read and referred to Messis. Morris Mayer and Pigman.

Also the following resolutions.

A resolution relative to the several sinking funds of the state;

A resolution relative to the common free schools fund.

And a resolution authorising the governor to draw on the treasurer, for such sum as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the full length likeness of the late Charles Carroll of Carrollton.
