The question was put,

"Will the senate assent to said amendment?"

So it was determined in the affirmative.

The bill was then read through, and

Ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Young Mens' Society, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Claude,

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act to promote internal improvement; was taken up for consideration, and the amendment adopted yesterday, receded from.

The bill was then read the third time by special order passed and returned to the house of delegates.
