

FRIDAY, February 23th, 1834.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland Steam Boat Company.

Was read the second time, and

Ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Claude from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act relating to the state library, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Montgomery from the committee to which the leave was granted reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid the deed therein mentioned.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the incorporation of Miller Lodge No. 18 of the Order of Independent Odd Fellows, in Talbot county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment.

Which was read and assented to:

At the end of the 3d section add.

“Provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or taken to confer banking privileges.”

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to extend to the Baltimore and Susquehanna rail road company certain privileges and powers heretofore granted to the Baltimore and Ohio rail road company.

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
