And returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to the jail of Baltimore city and county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 98, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Morris from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of John Henderson late of the city of Baltimore deceased.

Which was read the first time.

It was read the second and by special order the third time and passed.
