

WEDNESDAY, March 5th, 1834.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution directing the armorer to deliver to Capt. William B. Everett, certain arms, and

The resolution authorising the governor to call out a portion of the militia to suppress a riot on the Baltimore and Washington rail road, severally assented to by the senate on yesterday, and

The bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to erect Baltimore town in Baltimore county into a city and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and

The bill entitled, an act for the re-valuation and re-assessment of all the real and personal property in Cecil county, severally passed by the senate on yesterday with amendments, were returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to restrain the sale of ardent spirits in the village of Brookville in Montgomery county.

Was read the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The President announced the order of the day, being the bill entitled, a supplement to the act to establish a bank in the District of Columbia.

On motion of Mr. Wootton,

The said bill was postponed and made the order of the day for Friday next, the 7th inst.

Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for the cession of the territorial jurisdiction of this state over certain land on Piney Point in St. Mary's county, to the United States, for the erection of a Light House thereon, reported favorably thereon.
