

MONDAY, March 10th, 1834.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The message adopted on Saturday by the senate in answer to the message of the house of delegates proposing to close the present session on Saturday the 15th inst. was sent, and

The bill entitled, an act to lay off a primary school district in that part of the village called Ellicott's Mills, being in Anne Arundel county rejected by the senate on Saturday, was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road from the Green Field Mills in Frederick county, to the neighbourhood of Clarksburgh in Montgomery county, reported favourably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favour of the chaplains of both houses, and

The resolution relative to the trustees of Washington Academy, in Kent county, reported favourably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hughlett submitted the following report:

The committee to whom was referred a resolution in favour of William McMillen of Mercer county, state of Pennsylvania, report unfavourably thereon, for the following reasons:

By the certificate of George G.
