

of remarks opposite his name, is the following entry "June 1799 out of the rolls" his name does not appear upon any of the pay rolls to have received pay for military services, and if he had been appointed Lieutenant as he states in his declaration, his account would certainly have appeared upon the army ledger, but his name is not to be found upon any of the ledgers, and it is further stated that under the act of 1788 to dispose of the reserved land westward of Fort Cumberland, and to fulfil the engagement made by the state, to the officers and soldiers of the Maryland line that one hundred lots were set apart to fulfil the engagements of lands to recruiting officers, the commissioners appointed under said act returned a record to the office containing a list of the officers entitled to bounty land and the name of William McMillen is not upon said record.

Your committee are unanimously of the opinion, from the above premises, that it is a fair presumption that the said William McMillen deserted the service, or was dismissed for improper conduct, and therefore recommend the rejection of the resolution in his favour.

The said resolution^s was then read the second, and by special order the third time dissented from and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act supplementary to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the town of Boonsborough Slifer's Addition, Holler's Addition, and Allabaugh's Addition to Boonsborough, in Washington county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 139, reported favorably thereon.
