

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on revolutionary claims to which was referred the resolution in favor of Anne Goldsborough, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Pigman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the preservation of the breed of wild deer in Washington and Allegany counties, passed at November session 1795, chapter 49, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments:

Which were read and assented to:

Strike out all the title and insert:

A further supplement to the act entitled, "an act for the preservation of the breed of wild deer and for other purposes therein mentioned."

In the 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th line of 1st section;

Strike out the words, referred to act passed at November session 1795, chapter 49, for the preservation of deer as it relates to Allegany county especially, and insert, "act to which this is a further supplement."

After the word "had" in 7th line of 1st section, insert "in Allegany county."

Strike out the words, "the law of November session 1795, chapter 49," in the 8th and 9th lines of the 1st section and insert, "this act and the act to which this is a further supplement."

In the 16th and 17th lines of the 1st section,

Strike out the words "of November session 1795," and insert "to which this is a further supplement:"

Strike out the words "to the contrary" in the 4th line, of the 2nd section and insert "and."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.
