was referred the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate the issuing licences to traders, keepers of ordinaries and others, reported favorably thereon.

Was read the second time.

Mr. Wootton from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Frederick by the way of Smithsburgh in Washington county to the Pennsylvania line.

The bill entitled, an act for the building a bridge over McIntosh Run in St. Mary's county, and

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, passed at November session 1820, reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on finance to which was referred the petition of Randle H. Moale, and others, reported the following resolution.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Whereas, it has been represented to this General Assembly, that a certain suit or suits are now depending in Baltimore county ccurt instituted against the collector employed to complete the collection of Robert C. Asquith late collector of the city of Baltimore, or of certain districts therein. Therefore

Be it resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that all proceedings against R. H. Moale, and others, securities of the said Robert Asquith as collector, be and they are hereby suspended until the first day of January next: Provided that nothing herein contained shall have any force or effect unless the assent of R. H. Moale, George Winchester and Charles Hogg, be filed in writing with the clerk of Baltimore county court on or before the first day of May next.
