

The engrossed bills from No. 89, to No. 97 inclusive, and from No. 168, to No. 173 inclusive, were read and assented to and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates returned said bills endorsed "read and assented to;" and delivered the engrossed bills of the house of delegates, from No. 98 to No. 167 inclusive.

Which were read and assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

His Excellency Governor Thomas appeared in the Senate Chamber.

On motion of Mr Emory,

The following order was read and adopted:

Ordered, that Messrs. Emory and Claude, inform the house of delegates that the Governor is in the Senate Chamber ready to sign and seal such engrossed bills as are prepared, and request their attendance to witness that ceremony.

Messrs. Emory and Claude left the Senate Chamber, and after a time returned and informed the senate that the house of delegates would attend forthwith.

Accordingly the Honorable Speaker and Members of the house of delegates appeared in the senate chamber.

When His Excellency Governor Thomas, signed and sealed the engrossed bills from No. 74, to No. 173, inclusive, in presence of both branches of the General Assembly, in conformity with the provisions of the constitution and form of government:

The Honorable Speaker and Members of the house of delegates retired from the Senate Chamber.
