The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish a bank in the District of Columbia, was being read the third time; when,

On motion of Mr. Morris,

The following amendments was proposed:

Strike out after the word "state" in the third page, the following words "until the year eighteen hundred and forty five, and after 1845, such bonus as the legislature may at that time impose on the banks of this state."

Add the following as the 9th section:

"And be it enacted, That this act shall continue in force until the expiration of the year eighteen hundred and forty five, and until the end of the next session of assembly thereafter. Provided also, That on or before the first day of July next, the individual stockholders in said bank shall at a general meeting called agreeably to the provisions of the original act to which this is a supplement, declare their assent to this act, and that said bank agrees to accept of the terms and conditions herein contained, are required to transmit to the executive of this state a certificate of such determination; otherwise every thing herein contained shall ever thereafter be of no effect in law."

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

The bill and amendments were ordered to lie on the table.
