Also returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the widening of Orange Alley, in the city of Baltimore, passed at December session 1827, chapter 124, endorsed, 'will pass with the proposed amendment.'

Which amendment was read and adopted, and was as follows:

Strike out the word 'act' in the 5th line of the 1st section, to the end of the section.

Also returned the following bills which originated in the senate, severally endorsed 'will not pass.'

The bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act for the relief of creditors and to prevent frauds and deceits, occasioned by secret sales, mortgages and gifts of goods and chattels.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act against excessive usury.

The resolutions relative to the removal of the public deposites from the United States Bank,

Were read the third time, when

On motion of Mr. Emory,

The following was read as a substitute:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the evils imposed upon the country by the removal of the public treasure from the Bank of the United States, (the depository appointed by law,) are deeply telt and deprecated by the people of Maryland.

Resolved further, That this act is more earnestly regretted in consequence of its violating a solemn contract entered into by the government of the United States, and because the President of the United States, has therein been guilty of an usurpation, which if encouraged, or not promptly denounced and corrected, must lead to the destruction of liberty.
