Mr. Claude submitted the following resolution,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for third a reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Claude,

Read the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That so much of resolution No. 79, December session 1831, as authorises the Governor and Council to appoint some person or persons to supervise the printing of the report, on the digest of the laws from the copy to be furnished by Jno. Buchanan and Reverdy Johnson, Esqrs. be and the same is hereby repealed.

Mr. Claude from the committee on the library, to which was referred the resolution relative to the Journals of the Conventions of the Province of Maryland, in the years 1774, '75, '76, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the resolution repealing a resolution, passed at the present session, authorising the register of the land office to remove certain records to Baltimore county court, reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to be assented to.
