It was read the second and by special order the third time, dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act supplementary to the act, to provide for the appointment of the Visitors and Governors of the Jail of Baltimore county, and prescribing their powers and duties, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

Was read the second time.

Mr. Emory from the committee on colored population, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise James Brown of Calvert county, to bring into this state his wife Rachel Brown, a free woman of color,

And the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of William Saulsbury, of Caroline county, reported that the committee had had said bills under consideration and were of opinion they ought not to pass.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The resolution relative to the Maryland Hospital,

Was read the third time by special order, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.
