

Also delivered a resolution in favor of William M'Neir,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Also returned the resolution which originated in the senate, requiring the geologist appointed by act of assembly, to make a survey of the state to deposite the specimens he may collect in certain literary institutions, endorsed, "assented to."

Also returned the resolution which originated in the senate, relative to the Maryland Hospital, endorsed, "assented to with the proposed amendment."

Which amendment was read and adopted, and was as follows:

Add the following at the end of the resolution:

"Provided nevertheless, the power is hereby reserved to the state, at any time to resume the possession of said property, upon paying to the city of Baltimore, such sum of money as may be hereafter expended by her in the improvement, and furnishing said hospital and lots.

Also returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to mortgages, endorsed, 'will pass.'

Also returned the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to people of color in this state, endorsed, 'will pass.'

Also returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, "an act for the benefit of Ransley Brookes, of Frederick county, endorsed, "will pass."

Also returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors of this state, passed at November session 1805, chapter 110, endorsed, "will not pass."

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of William M'Neir, reported favorably thereon.
