The accompanying drawings present an elevation of the front, with the arrangement of their rooms and their dimensions.

There are at present in the house, twenty-three patients and ten nurses and attendants; of the nurses four are sisters of charity, one of whom "is the superior," that is clerk and superintendant of the whole establishment; another acts as chief nurse, whose duty it is to attend the patients, assisted by a male and female cell keeper: the third has charge of the kitchen department, with a female assistant; and the fourth superintends the washing the clothes, room, mending, &c. with a female assistant.

There are also a gatekeeper, a laborer and a servant man for general purposes.

A student resides in the house.

The medical attendance at present is gratuitous: consisting of six physicians and four surgeons, who serve in rotation, the former for two months, the latter three months at a time.

A committee of the Board of Visitors is in constant attendance in the institution, to see that all things are well directed. Of the above 23 patients, 17 pay their dues regularly amounting to (being from \$7 to \$3 per week,) the sum of \$80 per week; the remaining six, being county patients, have not been paid for, and are at this time a burthen upon the institution.
