The petition of sundry citizens of Somerset County, for a fire proof office for the safe keeping of the public records of said county, referred to the consideration of the house of delegates, on Saturday, and

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the making a general alphabetical index of the land records of Baltimore County, from the year 1799 inclusive, and to keep up such index henceforth, passed by the senate on Saturday, were sent to the house of delegates.
