16th section of the act of 1817, chapter 148 entitled, an act relating to the City of Baltimore.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Morris Mayer and Wootton.

A bill entitled, an act to repeal an act passed at December session 1833 chapter 111

Which was read the first time and referred to the

committee on colored population.

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution for the payment of the members of the legislature and the efficient thereof, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time assented to and returned to the house of deligates.

12 o'clock having arrived, the sengte proceeded to the election of United States Senator. The halvet hox was prepared and the ballots deposited therein. It was then sealed up and delivered to Messrs. Hughlett and Emory who were appointed by the senate, in a minutation with the committee of the house of delegates the emittine halvets and report the result. They retired, and after a time returned and reported, that on examination of the hallot box, it appeared there had been \$4 veresugiven in allow of which Robert H. Goldsborough, received, 6% veres, scattering, I vote, and there were 15 Hanks.

Whereupon it was declared, that the flow rable Robert H. Goldsborough, is duly elected a Scriptor, to represent this state, in the Congress of the United States, to supply the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of

the Honorable Ezekiel F. Chambers.

Mr. Hughlett submitted the following message; Which was read and adopted.

By the Senate, Jan. 7, 1835.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The Honorable Robert II. Goldsborough, having been elected Senator of the United States, is the place of the Honorable E. F. Chambers, resigned. We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body, that a joint letter from the President of the senate and Speaker of the house of delegates, be forthwith forwarded to him, by express, informing him of his election.
