They retired and after a time returned and reported, that on examination of the ballot box, they found there had been 84 votes given. In all of which for Kent county, James F. Brown, had 68 votes, and for Calvert county, James A. D. Dalrymple, had 67 votes; scattering, 3 votes, and there were 12 blanks.

Whereupon it was declared, that for Kent county, James F. Browne, and for Calvert county, James A. D. Dalrymple, are severally and duly elected, to be recommended to the governor and council, to be commissioned as Registers of Wills, for said counties respec-

tively.

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance to which was referred the resolution in layor of William H. Baldwin of Anne Arundel county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time and assented to.

His Excellency Governor Thomas appeared in the senate chamber.

On motion of Mr. Page,

It was ordered, that a committee consisting of Messrs. Page and Morris, be appointed to inform the house of delegates that the governor elect is in the senate chamber, for the purpose of qualifying, and to request the attendance of the members of that house

Messrs. Page and Morris left the senate chamber, and after a time returned and reported, that the members of

the house of delegates, would attend forthwith.

Accordingly, the honorable Speaker and members of the house of delegates appeared in the senate chamber; when his excellency governor Thomas took the several oaths required by the constitution and laws.

The honorable Speaker and members of the house of

delegates retired from the senate chamber

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
