

The communication of the treasurer of the western shore, made in obedience, to the third section of the act of 1824, chapter 149, referred yesterday by the senate, to the consideration of the house of delegates, was sent, and

The resolution in favor of William H. Baldwin, of Anne Arundel county, assented to by the senate on yesterday, was returned to the house of delegates.

The President laid before the senate a communication from Thomas Culbreth Esquire clerk of the council, made in compliance with the direction of a resolution of December session 1830:

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Joshua B. Iiams, of Anne Arundel county.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Edward W. Belt, former sheriff of Prince Georges county.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed at December session 1833, chapter 250.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

On motion of Mr. Wootton,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Wootton, Pigman and Emory, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act to repeal an act passed at December session 1832, chapter 318, and for other purposes.

On motion of Mr. Morris,

The bill entitled, an act relating to guardians and wards; was referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
