

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to confirm an act to alter and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relates to the division of Frederick county, into twelve election districts, and for other purposes, passed at December session 1831, chapter 112.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Emory and Montgomery.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Margaret Dods, of Frederick county.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

And returned the resolution which originated in the senate, requesting the governor, to issue a commission as Senator, to the Honorable Robert H. Goldsborough, endorsed, "read and assented to."

Mr. Claude from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise Thomas Baldwin, present sheriff of Prince Georges county, to bond as sheriff of said county, at any time before the first day of February next, and to authorise the clerk of said county to receive and record said bond, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time and passed.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

MONDAY, January 12th, 1835.

The senate met. Present the same senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Forrest who had been confined to his room by indisposition appeared in the senate chamber and took his seat.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise Thomas Baldwin, present sheriff of Prince Georges county to bond as sheriff of said county, at any time before the first day of February next, and to authorise the clerk of said county to receive and record said bond, passed by the senate on Saturday, was returned to the house of delegates.
