By the Senate, January 13, 1835.

Gentlemen of the house of delegates,

We respectfully ask leave to refer to the consideration of your honorable body, the memorial of the trustees and visitors of the Maryland Hospital, with the view of suggesting the propriety of the appointment of a committee of your honorable body and of the senate, that they may examine into the condition and learn the wants of the Maryland Hospital; and thereby ascertain how far it is capable of performing, or has realized the just expectations of the public; so that such legislation may ensue as is calculated to correct any defects, (if they exist,) in its present organization, and extend to it that measure of aid which an enlightened and humane policy may dictate, consistent with the ability of the state.
