Mr. Claude from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act authorising Officers of the Army, or Navy of the United States, to bring their servants, being slaves, into this state.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third read-

ing.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Weverton Manusfacturing Company.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Pigman, Claude and Emory.

The senate adjourned until to morrow morning 10 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, January 14th, 1835.

The senate met. Present the same senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The President laid before the senate a letter from Nathaniel F. Williams. Esq a member elect of the council, communicating his acceptance of the appointment.
